The Greeting

Grace, mercy and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ be with you all. And also with you.

Grace, meaning 'favour' or 'gift' (translating the Latin *gratia* and the Greek *charis*) refers to God's unconditional love for the world, shown in the gifts he gives to the human race – life, food, intelligence, friendship and, above all, forgiveness and the new life in Christ. None of these things are earned or deserved. They are simply gifts – to be received humbly and gratefully. Our collect for today reminds us of the need for God's grace as we meet in our homes for worship and prayer.

By grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing: it is the gift of God. (*Eph. 2:8*)

God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us. (Rom. 5:5)

Gracious God, as we gather in our homes to worship you, make us thankful for your special gifts, aware of our many failings, humble to receive forgiveness, and open to the Holy Spirit who fills us with your life and love, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

²The Israelites had journeyed from Rephidim, entered the wilderness of Sinai, and camped in the wilderness; Israel camped there in front of the mountain. ³Then Moses went up to God; the LORD called to him from the mountain, saying, "Thus you shall say to the house of Jacob, and tell the Israelites: ⁴You have seen what I did to the Egyptians, and how I bore you on eagles' wings and brought you to myself. ⁵Now therefore, if you obey my voice and keep my covenant, you shall be my treasured possession out of all the peoples. Indeed, the whole earth is mine, ⁶ but you shall be for me a priestly kingdom and a holy nation. These are the words that you shall speak to the Israelites."

³⁵ Then Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and curing every disease and every sickness. ³⁶ When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. ³⁷ Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; ³⁸ therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest."

Then Jesus summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to cure every disease and every sickness. ²These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon, also known as Peter, and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee, and his brother John; ³Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; ⁴Simon the Cananaean, and Judas Iscariot, the one who betrayed him.

⁵These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions: "Go nowhere among the Gentiles, and enter no town of the Samaritans, ⁶but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. ⁷As you go, proclaim the good news, "The kingdom of heaven has come near.' ⁸Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons. You received without payment; give without payment.

The Sermon

Bless all who promote justice and reconciliation throughout the world.

We give thanks for the support and care of our families and friends. We pray for those who have returned to work in recent days, those who are preparing to return and those who are anxious about their business and employment.

Enlarge our love to include those who are lonely or troubled.

We give thanks for what health we have as we pray for all medical staff and carers. **Bring healing, patience and hope to those who suffer pain and infirmity.**

We give thanks for those who have died, and pray for those left behind, particularly those who have not been able to grieve properly with family and friends due to funeral restrictions. **May we, with them, have a place in your eternal Kingdom.**

Merciful Father, accept all these prayers in the name of your Son, Jesus Christ. Amen.
