

The Rector writes.....

Now that our churches are open again, I am indebted to both Wilfred Baker and Keith Roberts, who take services in this Union of Parishes when the Revd Hazel Minion is away or when I will be away for a couple of weeks of holidays later this summer. I know many parishioners really appreciate their ministry when they occupy the prayer desk and pulpit.

Lay Readers have a long and noble history in the Church of Ireland and in many places, they are vital to the maintenance of a regular pattern of Sunday worship in dioceses where there are clergy shortages. However, it should not be seen as a stop gap role. While they do cover clergy absences, in truth they are part of the liturgical ministry team in a parish who work along side their ordained colleagues. To emphasise this, in some parishes lay readers lead parts of the same service with the clergy.



This month I am delighted to announce that Dr Kieran Hogan will be licensed as a Diocesan Lay Reader at a service in St Fin Barre's Cathedral on Tuesday 8 June at 7pm, along with Alan Clohessy from Cloyne Union. Kieran is known to most of you in Douglas. He has been People's Churchwarden in St Luke's for a several years relinquishing this at the last Easter General Vestry. He is also Honorary Secretary of the Select Vestry so Kieran is a busy man. In his professional life, he is a consultant anaesthetist and intensivist at the Mater Hospital here in Cork. He is married to Rosie, and they have three children, Emily, Ben and Tom. In 2019 Kieran completed the Course in Christian Studies which is accredited by

Maynooth University. This is a first and essential part of lay reader training for those who want to pursue that path. He then felt a calling towards lay readership ministry and was interviewed and accepted for this. Kieran then went on to complete an additional unit of liturgical training so that now he is equipped in part for his new role.

In normal circumstances I would be asking you to turn out in large numbers to support Kieran at his licensing service in St Fin Barre's Cathedral. Unfortunately, due to the public health restrictions, those permitted to attend must be limited to family members, invited guests and officiating clergy only. However, the service can be watched as it is live-streamed on the cathedral webcam and so I strongly encourage to watch it on Tuesday evening and remember Kieran and Alan in your prayers as they take this new step in their discipleship and ministry.

I am delighted to confirm that the Bishop has placed Kieran with us in Douglas Union with Frankfield. In the coming weeks you will see him with me as we share in Sunday services together. I know you will continue to encourage and support Kieran, as you do Keith and Wilfred as well as others, such as Sabrina Cooke and Andrew Coleman, who have been with us for training purposes in the past.

Finally, I remind you that we need people to continue to offer themselves for the ministry of lay readership. There have been several retirements recently from the list of those who serve in this Diocese. We always need new Lay Readers. If you would like to have an informal conversation about what might be involved, please do not hesitate to contact me.

CONSIDERING CONFIRMATION?

I take this opportunity to notify parents and guardians of pupils currently in 6th class, or in secondary school, about the confirmation programme we hope will be running in the parish in the autumn. The impact of Covid-19 has meant that the programme will be slightly modified this year. There are still young parishioners who should have been confirmed in May 2020 who are waiting, and I look forward to their confirmation when it happens.

For those currently in 5th or 6th class or older, and are thinking about confirmation, I will run a series of classes, probably on Sunday mornings in Douglas at 12.15 after the 11.15 service. These will not start before October. All I am asking for at this stage is expressions of interest from the potential candidates. Once I have some idea of the size of the possible class(es), I will know how best to arrange things and how many groups I will need to plan and work with. In mid-September, an introductory meeting will be held for all parents of children considering confirmation.

I ask that you email me to register interest and let me know what class your son/daughter is currently in. This is not committing you at this stage but will be helpful to me as I plan. It is important that the decision to be confirmed rests with



the candidate themselves, so parents please take the opportunity to discuss it fully with them in advance of contacting me. *A. Wilkinson*
