Harvest Thanksgiving We are looking forward to celebrating Harvest in our 4

churches this month. Frankfield, Douglas and Blackrock will be holding their harvest services on Sunday 1st October, and Passage will hold an evening ecumenical service on the evening of the 15th at 7.30pm. Rev Roger Thompson, CMS Ireland, will be speaking in Frankfield and Douglas. Dr Kieran Hogan will be the preacher in Blackrock and Rev Hazel Minion will be the preacher in Passage.



United Service This year we are experimenting with holding a united service on the fifth Sunday of the month. In July we were all in St Luke's Douglas. On Sunday, 29th October parishioners from all the parishes in the Douglas Union with Frankfield will join in a United Family Service in Frankfield at 11:00am. We will be celebrating All Saints' Day with the presentation of flowers. During the service, those wishing to may bring forward plants or small bouquets of flowers with the names of those they wished remembered. After the service the flowers can be placed on graves or taken home to remember loved ones who have died.
